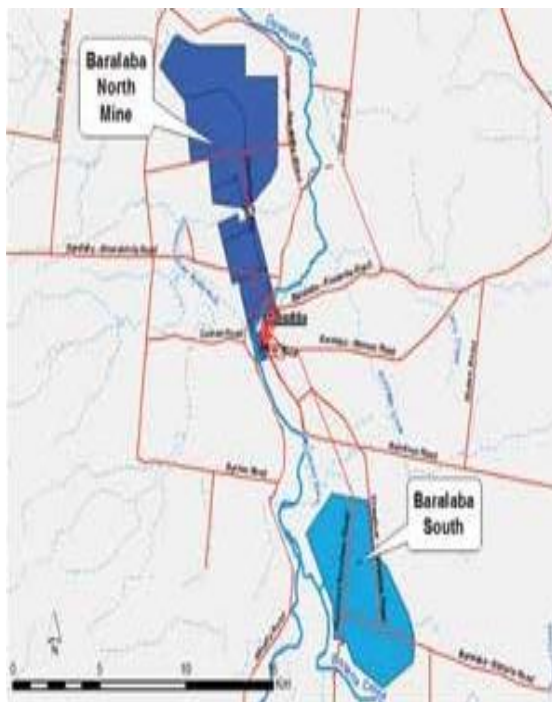

Approvals Process and Timeline

Environmental Impact Statement

An EIS is being prepared in accordance with the final Terms of Reference. The EIS is published for review and comment by stakeholders and all submissions must be addressed in a supplementary report and then amended where required.

Issue of Environmental Authority

If approved by Queensland Government an EIS Assessment Report is published, including draft conditions for the Project. Draft conditions are incorporated into an Environmental Authority (EA) under the Environmental Protection Act (EPA).

Granting of Mining Lease

Following issue of the EA the Mining Lease (ML) is granted under the *Mineral Resources Act 1989* by the Queensland Government. The (ML) must be in place prior to the commencement of the mining operations.

EIS Process

An EIS is being prepared for the Project to identify the environmental values of the Project area, the potential environmental impacts and the ways of avoiding, mitigating or offsetting the impacts. 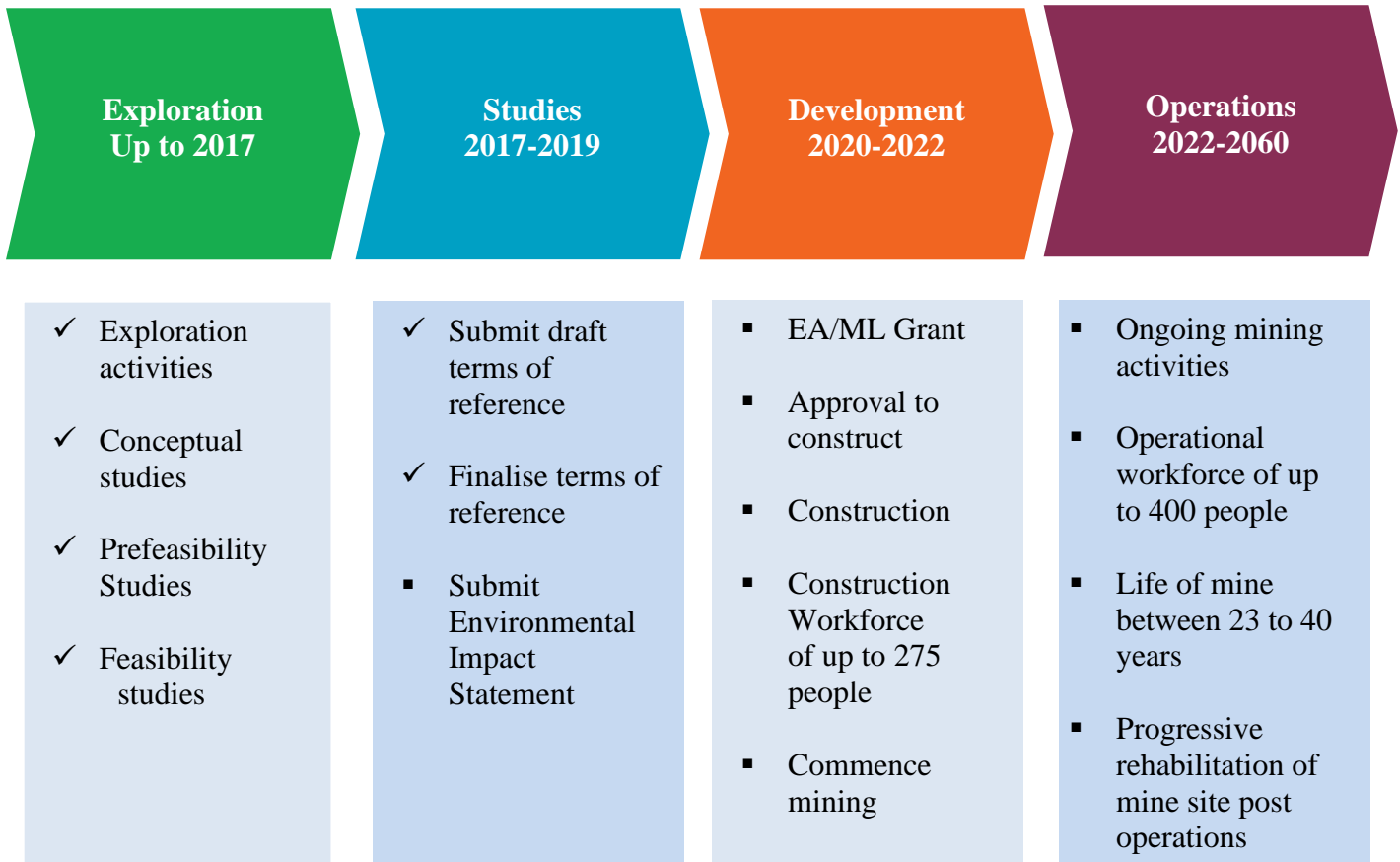
Baralaba South Project

It is estimated that at peak production the mine will provide employment opportunities for up to 400 people and during peak construction up to 275 jobs. It is expected to take approximately 6 to 12 months to establish the necessary infrastructure to commence mining in 2021.
