Mine Update

It's been a promising start to 2023 with the performance of the Mine tracking in accordance with expectations, the full year is expected to deliver approximately 1.8Mt. Fortunately, the mine hasn't been too greatly affected from heavy rain that is so often the case this time of year and the recent train derailment that occurred at Marmor. Mine rehabilitation works at Central are progressing well and the exploration program continues at North and South leases. Coal markets remain resilient despite signs that the global economy is gradually slowing as existing and new customers seek to secure supply contracts. The Mine has continued to refurbish existing Mine owned houses and is looking to mobilise 8 additional single person rooms at the Village to reduce reliance on local accommodation. Baralaba Coal would like to thank the Emergency Response Team onsite for attending a local emergency last month. The efforts they provided to assist the local emergency services during this event resulted in a successful outcome.

Repairs to the Moura-Baralaba Road have continued this month with asphalt repair to pavement failures being conducted in many sections along the roadway. General repairs to potholes, vegetation spraying and slashing has also been completed.
