General Mine Update

As 2023 comes to an end, the year has provided many highlights along with the usual challenges of adapting to changing weather and market conditions. There continues to be strong demand for high grade metallurgical coal across global markets which is essential to manufacture steel, noted by approximately 50 vessels currently waiting to be loaded at the Gladstone Port.

2023 Mine Highlights

- Total coal sales of 1.76 million tonnes (pending vessel berthing delays at Gladstone Port)
- 93% of total 2023 coal sales sold as PCI coal (used to produce steel)
- Major employer with approximately 480 full time positions
- Contributed approximately \$100 million to the Queensland Government Revised Royalties Scheme
- Reshaped, topsoiled and seeded approximately 200 hectares

2024 is shaping up to be a year like 2023 with approximately 1.7 million tonnes planned to be produced. Significant reinvestment of approximately \$50 million is planned to replace major components in the Baralaba owned Mine fleet and complete a major refurbishment of the existing Coal Handling Plant and Workshop facilities.

The amended Baralaba South Project EIS has been finalised and submitted to the Department of Environment and Science on 15 December 2023.

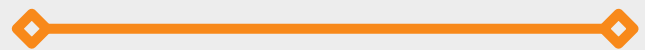
The Department of Environment and Science will now review the amended EIS submitted and complete an adequacy review determining whether it is ready for public release. Depending on this review will determine when the EIS becomes public, however, we hope that this will occur in the 2nd quarter of 2024. We will keep you informed of this progress and as soon we know when it is approved we will let you know.
